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**SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATION**

At 0341 hours on 1 Dec 14, SSgt [REDACTED] 36th Security Forces Squadron (SFS), Andersen Air Force Base (AAFB), GU, notified SA [REDACTED] AFOSI Det 602, AAFB, GU of a missing active duty airmen assigned to AAFB, GU. [REDACTED] stated that at 0156 hours on 1 Dec 14, A1C [REDACTED] 36th Civil Engineering Squadron (CES), AAFB, GU, reported he could not locate his friend, DECEASED, whose last known location was Tarague Beach, AAFB, GU.

[REDACTED] provided the following account about the night of the incident: [REDACTED] DECEASED, and SrA [REDACTED] 554th Red Horse Squadron (RHS), AAFB, GU, consumed alcohol in [REDACTED] room on the evening of 30 Nov 14. At approximately 2330 hours on 30 Nov 14, [REDACTED] and DECEASED departed [REDACTED] room and proceeded to tour AAFB, GU, ending their tour at Tarague Beach, AAFB, GU. Upon arrival, both [REDACTED] and DECEASED exited the vehicle. As he walked towards the beach, DECEASED called [REDACTED] on his cell phone to inform he was going to enter the water. [REDACTED] proceeded to [REDACTED] and then went to the beach to find DECEASED; however, he was unable to locate him. When [REDACTED] was unable to locate DECEASED, he proceeded to call the AAFB Fire Department for assistance but did not have cellular reception. He then proceeded back to his [REDACTED] room to report DECEASED missing.

On 4 Dec 14, human remains washed ashore at Tarague Beach, AAFB, GU. The remains were transported to Guam Memorial Hospital and a subsequent autopsy was initiated on 5 Dec 14. Dr. [REDACTED] Guam Memorial Hospital, Chief Medical Examiner, Tamuning, GU, compared DECEASED's existing dental x-rays to a visual inspection of DECEASED's teeth to make a positive identification. Dr. [REDACTED] stated there was no evidence of trauma to the remains. A review of DECEASED's toxicology report indicated 6 mg/dL for Acetaldehyde and 300 mg/dL for Ethanol. A review of both the Death Certificate and Autopsy Report revealed cause and manner of death to be undetermined.

AFOSI conducted numerous witness interviews and investigative activities in an attempt to gather more information as to the facts and circumstances surrounding DECEASED's death. Many rumors were noted regarding DECEASED's death, but AFOSI identified the source and determined they had no merit. Reviews of cellular phone logs of both DECEASED and [REDACTED] indicated no communication between DECEASED and [REDACTED] on the evening of 30 Nov 14 or morning of 1 Dec 14. However, all other calls were consistent with [REDACTED] testimony. Additionally, the review of DECEASED's phone provided two videos from that night of him and [REDACTED] doing "doughnuts" in [REDACTED] truck which is consistent with [REDACTED] recollection of the base tour. Civ [REDACTED] recalled talking to DECEASED on the phone and confirmed they were doing "doughnuts." Call logs indicate the call came in at 0019 hours on 1 Dec 14. An interview SrA [REDACTED] 81st Medical Operations Squadron, Keesler AFB, MS, indicated [REDACTED] told her that he and DECEASED went to the beach that night to swim.

On 18 Feb 15 and 29 Jan 16, [REDACTED] consented to two separate polygraph examinations regarding any involvement he may have had in DECEASED's death. During both examinations, [REDACTED] provided the same information he had already provided to AFOSI in previous interviews regarding the evening of 30 Nov 14 and morning of 1 Dec 14. Both examinations rendered No Opinion based on an analysis of the physiological data collected.

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
